



Time and Venue

August 26-27, 2026, Kaunas University of Technology main campus, Faculty of Informatics, Studentu str. 50, Kaunas¹ – [Google StreetView link](#).

Trafi app or [this website](#) are recommended for Kaunas city bus trip planning. Bolt services are also available but there's no Uber (it's in Vilnius only). A walk to the Centre of town is ≥ 3 kilometres and takes you through the picturesque park that is home to almost 800 old oak trees.

Travel

Option 1 – flight to Vilnius (~100 km away from Kaunas). From the Vilnius Airport you can reach Vilnius bus station and Vilnius train station, both of which are next to each other, by train (~250 m. from the terminal; tickets sold in the train), by city bus (right next to the terminal), or by taxi/Bolt/Uber. Then, you can take either a bus or a train to Kaunas, depending on your preference.

Option 2 – flight to Kaunas. May be less feasible due to lack of direct flights from SECURE-NET member cities. To get to the Centre of town you can take taxi/Bolt (about 15 km.) or city bus No. 29 from outside the terminal (tickets in the bus; about 35 minutes).

- [Ibis Kaunas Centre](#) or [Ibis Styles Kaunas Centre](#), - both 3 stars and both next to Kaunas bus station and ~500 metres from the train station.

5 Fun Facts about Kaunas :)

1. “Modernist Kaunas: Architecture of Optimism, 1919-1939” is a Unesco World Heritage list object that comprises over 1500 unique interwar buildings.
2. Two largest rivers of Lithuania, Nemunas and Neris, wrap the Kaunas Old Town and you can walk right up to their confluence.
3. Kaunas Žalgiris Arena has been voted the best arena of premier European basketball league, Euroleague, three times.
4. Area of Kaunas is about 1,5 times larger than that of Paris or Lisbon.
5. Laisvės alėja or Freedom Avenue is the longest pedestrian-only street in Eastern Europe.
